

Victims of cruelty cared for at partner hospitals (2014-2018): 471








Animal Cruelty & Domestic Incidents

- 2014-2016: 66 Cases of co-occurring animal abuse and human interpersonal violence
- ~8% of all New York City Animal Cruelty Cases



Cases by Borough 2014-2016



Case Dispositions






Misdemeanor Animal Cruelty Felony Animal Cruelty

Endangering the Welfare of a Child



- Indicted for Felony Animal Cruelty on September 14, 2017
- Defendant also had open warrant for Criminal Possession of a Weapon (CPW)
- Plea: Misdemeanor CPW, Felony Animal Cruelty
- Sentence: 2 years for felony cruelty,10 year animal ownership ban,
 Animal Abuse Registry, 1 year misdemeanor CPW

Medical Findings

- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Nasal bone fractures
- Lower jaw fractures
- Lung injury, 3 rib fractures
- Liver lacerations, blood loss
- Broken right femur





2 month-old, female, Siamese kitten (1.6 lb.)



Charges & Outcome

Charges

Assault
Harassment
Menacing
Obstruction of Breathing
Felony Animal Cruelty

- DV survivor did not testify
- Plea: Misdemeanor Animal Cruelty
- Sentence: 45 days jail

Victim was able to move out of state while defendant was in jail

Background





Medical Findings

- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Ruptured and proptosed eye
- Nasal bone fracture
- Soft tissue injury and contusions to the face
- Fractured Teeth
- Contusions under tongue
- Pneumothorax







Medical Findings

- Acute fractures of 14th and 15th caudal vertebral bodies; left 3rd, 4th, and 5th metacarpal bones; and right 2nd, 3rd, and 4th metacarpal bones
- Chronic healed fracture of left 5th metacarpal bone
- Subluxation of right accessory-ulnar intercarpal joint
- Soft tissue injury left hind foot







Outcome

- Owner surrendered due to concern for safety
- Adopted by member of NYC veterinary community
- Defendant charged with and pleaded guilty to Felony Animal Cruelty
